

# LAY OF THE LAND



*In Grandfather Lived Here, released to commemorate Bridgehampton's 350th anniversary, Ann Sanford of the Bridgehampton Historical Society notes that the modern-day Bridgehampton includes five colonial settlements—Mecox, Sagaponack, Hay Ground, Scuttle Hole and Bull Head (the once common name for Bridgehampton's Main Street)—each of which had its own commons for grazing livestock. The livestock are nearly all gone, but the legacy of life centered on food remains. Edible salutes this heritage with a map of Bridgehampton farmstands, wineries, restaurants, and artisanal producers. Thanks to Tom Morgan of Orient for drawing the map and to the Bridgehampton Historical Society for their contributions to this effort.*

## MAP KEY

1. Hayground Market, Montauk Highway (Hwy. 27), 2 miles west of Bridgehampton. Local vegetables, fruits and flowers. 537-1676.
2. Hayground Farm, Montauk Hwy., Bridgehampton, opposite LIPA. Local vegetables, fruits and flowers.
3. Bridgehampton Country Market, 2209 Montauk Hwy., Bridgehampton. Full service market featuring local produce, Mecox Bay Dairy cheeses, Tiger Potato Chips, and Hamptons Honey. Open

daily, 7 a.m.-7 p.m. 537-1048.

4. Candy Kitchen, corner of Bridgehampton Main St. (Montauk Hwy.) and School St. Homemade ice cream.
5. Pierre's Restaurant, 2468 Main St., Bridgehampton. Patisserie in front of restaurant sells homemade pastries, ice cream and sorbets. Open daily. 537-5110.
6. Wölffer Estate Vineyard, 136 Sagg Rd., Sagaponack. Founded 1987. Wine tastings and tours. Featuring new release of 2005 rosé. Open daily, 11 a.m.-6 p.m. 537-5106.
7. Pike Farms, Sagg Main St., Sagaponack. "A quiet spot south of 27 where the tomatoes come early and the corn stays late." Local fruits and vegetables, flowers, artisanal breads. Open June–November, 9 a.m.-6 p.m., 537-5854.
8. Foster Farm Stand, Sagg Main St., Sagaponack. Small and choice, the freshest of the fresh.
9. Fairview Farm at Mecox, 19 Horsemill Ln., Bridgehampton. Fine produce May–October, as well as local vegetables and fruits, Mecox Bay Dairy artisanal raw milk cheeses, and their own popcorn. Corn maze September 3–October 31. 537-1445.
10. Amy's Flowers and Mini Milk Pail, 757 Mecox Rd., Water Mill.

Fruits, vegetables, apple cider, donuts and pies. 537-5999.

11. Babinski Farm, 791 Lumber Ln., Bridgehampton. Established 1929. Fresh eggs, homegrown vegetables and fruits.

12. Channing Daughters Winery. 1927 Scuttlehole Rd., Bridgehampton. "Drink Local." Winery tastings. This summer featuring three rosés. Also sell Channing Daughters merlot, riesling and sauvignon blanc wine jellies. Open daily, 11 a.m.-6 p.m.
