

2013 The Old Field Chardonnay "Barrel Fermented"

The 2013 Chardonnay "Barrel Fermented" has the oak partially obscuring flavors at this point, but it is fair to note that it was not even yet released when tasted. It may and should evolve more. It is perky and elegant underneath. In its style, it should come into better balance and drink well over the next few years, making it a very nice bargain.

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2007 The Old Field Merlot "Commodore Perry"

The 2007 Merlot "Commodore Perry" is in fine shape just now and it should remain that way for the next several years, at the least. Showing nice depth of fruit, it has lovely flavors dribbling onto the palate and a sunny demeanor. If it stops a step short of fascinating, it is aging gracefully and beginning to show some complexity. This should make a great food wine.

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2010 The Old Field Pinot Noir

The 2010 Pinot Noir is fresh and lively, with a slight, earthy nuance on the finish. There is not much concentration here, though, although there is some viscosity. The lively feel here serves this well and the acidity should preserve it a reasonable time.

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2012 The Old Field Blanc de Noir

The 2012 Blanc de Noir is all sparkling Pinot Noir. Vibrant, but showing some traces of oxidation, this has intensity on the finish and a piercing demeanor, but it doesn't project a lot of freshness at this point. Overall, it drinks nicely now and is reasonably persistent. It wouldn't hurt to dive in.
